As Gordon Jones' 90th birthday approaches, this remarkable pilot owns and continues to fly Tiger Moth #1214, one of the aircraft in which he taught students at #5 Elementary Flying Training School (High River) during World War II. For more than twenty years, Gordon has performed fly-pasts over special events at the Bomber Command Museum of Canada. His flying career is unique in the history of Canadian aviation –but there is much more than flying to Gordon's story . . .
